## ABSTRACT

The Darfur region is located in the western part of Sudan, the largest country in Africa and has been in conflict since 2003. This conflict is one that is along ethnic and tribal lines. This research was carried out to investigate the effects of human rights abuse in the Darfur conflict. The report shows the findings on the topic and the recommendations made by the researcher; it however gives brief overview to the Darfur conflict, the management of this conflict and how it has brought about cases of human rights abuses. It also explains why despite an array of international instruments having been deployed to address this conflict, including peacekeepers, peacemakers, special envoys, mediators, sanctions, embargoes and criminal prosecutions, peace has remained elusive as ever in this region. This research paper examines mediation efforts and suggests why they failed and gives a possible solution to this conflict.
